



RUCK / RUCKSACK

A RUCKSACK IS A BACKPACK USED TO CARRY EQUIPMENT, SUPPLIES, OR ADDITIONAL WEIGHTS DURING PHYSICAL EXERCISE

RUCKER

A "RUCKER" IS A PERSON WHO IS "RUCKING" IN OPERATION IRON RUCK

RUCK MARCH "RUCKING"

"Rucking" is a challenging exercise in which military personnel march or walk while carrying a loaded rucksack. Testing endurance, physical strength & mental resilience.

OPERATION IRON RUCK







Operation Iron Ruck (OIR) is an annual initiative led by the Auburn Student Veterans Association (ASVA) and the University of Alabama Student Veterans Association (SVA), to raise critical awareness for veteran suicide prevention. With Alabama ranking among the states with the highest veteran suicide rates, OIR was created to bring visibility to this epidemic, foster community engagement, and support life-saving programs for our nation's heroes.

Founded in 2018 by student veterans from both universities, OIR was born from a shared commitment to serve beyond the uniform. Each year, during the week of the Iron Bowl, student veterans, alumni, and ROTC cadets from Auburn and Alabama ruck side by side, marching 151 miles from the away team stadium to the home team. Along the way, they carry the game ball and the memories of those we've lost, forging bonds, sharing stories of strength, struggle, and resilience.

Operation Iron Ruck is more than a march - it's a movement. It's veterans standing shoulder to shoulder through the weight of their experiences and the literal weight of their rucksacks. It's a healing journey that creates connection, community, and hope. Over the years, OIR has evolved into a powerful statewide tradition, supported by generous sponsors, hundreds of volunteers, and an ever-growing community.

The 2025 Operation Iron Ruck promises to be the largest and most impactful yet. With your support, we will continue to amplify awareness, reduce stigma, and directly support veteran-focused organizations across Alabama.

Together, we are saving lives - one mile at a time.



All contributions to the foundation are tax-deductible and go directly toward supporting veterans in need.

This year, we've set a bold goal: raise \$75,000 to expand outreach and fund meaningful support for veterans across Alabama. Your gift helps us reach those in crisis, deliver essential care items to veterans in VA healthcare facilities, to show every veteran encountered that they are not forgotten.


